Business Employment and Wage Data

contain employment and wage information for workers covered by California Unemployment Insurance laws. This data serves as a near census of monthly employment and quarterly wage information at the state and county levels. Business employment and wage data are published on a quarterly basis.

Labor Force Data are monthly and annual estimates of civilian labor force, employment, unemployment, and unemployment rates by place of residence. These estimates serve as key indicators of local economic conditions. Labor force data are published on a monthly basis.

Occupational Employment Statistics and Wages are estimates of occupational employment and wages for over 800 occupations and are available at state and local levels. Estimates are updated and published on our website on an annual basis.

Industry and Occupational Employment

Projections display the changes in industry and occupational employment resulting from industry growth, exits, and transfers. Short-term (two year) projections are available at the state level and long-term (ten year) projections are available at the state and local level.



The **EDD Data Library** contains viewable and downloadable data regarding California's labor force, industries, occupations, employment projections, wages, disability insurance, and unemployment insurance.



Data Dashboards are interactive dashboards displaying labor market information on state and local geographic areas. The LMID has the ability to build custom dashboards for a nominal fee.



The **Veterans Day Workforce Report** highlights veterans' participation in the labor force, skill sets acquired through military training, and industry sectors and occupational employment with the highest concentration of veterans.



The **Analyst Resource Center Employer Database** contains employer contact information, number of employees, and industry descriptions. The database is developed by Data Axle, Omaha, Nebraska. Data Axle provides the database to state employment security agencies under an agreement with the Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration.



Occupational Guides provide detailed information on wages, job outlook, education, and licensing requirements for approximately 300 occupations. These guides provide students and jobseekers with occupational information to assist with making informed career choices.



In honor of Labor Day, the **Labor Day Briefing** presents significant labor market trends and current statistics related to California's job market.



The **Monthly Data Press Release** provides revised and preliminary civilian labor force, unemployment rates, and industry employment data for California, metropolitan areas, counties, and sub-county areas.
