Summary	 Researchers at Green Technology tracked concrete efforts by California local government to cap local greenhouse gas emissions. Their efforts can be divided into three legislative categories: 1. Agreements and declarations that commit a city to a numerical reduction of carbon dioxide over time (i.e., U.S. Conference of Mayors' Climate Protection Agreement (CPA) and the Cool Counties Climate Stabilization Initiative). 2. Structured programs that provide cities with a standardized framework for combating global warming (i.e., International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives (ICLEI) and Cities for Climate Protection (CCP). 3. Action plans that address the specific needs of a city or county (i.e., Climate Action Plans (CAPs)). With top-down support with State Assembly Bill 32 and the various solutions from local government, the State of California was said to be "poised to effectively combat global warming."
Key Findings	"As more cities on the U.S. Mayors' CPA and develop Climate Action Plans, collaboration among officials on policy implementation and strong regional leadership from counties will be essential. With top-down support from AB 32 and bottom-up solutions from cities and counties, the state of California is poised to effectively combat global warming."
