Summary	This report, compiled in December 2008, presents the results from a study conducted by The American Solar Energy Society (ASES) and Colorado and Management Information Services (CMIS) which focused on gaining in-depth knowledge on the renewable energy and energy efficiency (RE&EE) industries in Colorado and in the U.S.  The study followed three key steps to achieve a better understanding of these industries:  • "Development of a rigorous definition of the RE and the EE industries,"  • Determination of the approximate size and composition of the industry  • The formation of three different forecasts of the industries in 2030 based on three different scenarios (base, moderate and advanced).  The study found that the RE&EE industries, when grouped together, have a positive impact on both the U.S. and Colorado's economies, but more importantly have the potential for an even bigger impact if the proper steps are taken now (training, education, policies). The future is heavily dependent on what initiatives are taken now or in the near future, a delay in action will drastically delay reaching the goals that are set for 2030. The results of the three forecasts showed that "without significant changes in policy, RE&EE is not expected to significantly increase its share of the U.S. energy market."
Recommendations	<ul> <li>"In 2007 the U.S. RE&amp;EE industries generated \$1,045 billion in sales and created over 9 million jobs."</li> <li>Certain Renewable Energy sectors (wind, photovoltaics, ethanol, and biodiesel) in Colorado are "large players" in the U.S. market. Hydroelectric power, geothermal, and biomass power play a much smaller role in the U.S. market.</li> <li>It will not work to "use RE as a job creation program for the disadvantaged, the chronically unemployed or target populations" in Colorado.</li> <li>The Renewable Energy (RE) industry alone is not a big part of Colorado's economy.
