Key Findings	Economic models estimate 26,600 jobs are created for every billion dollars of freight rail capital
,	investment; 7,800 being green jobs. The rail industry has nearly doubled the amount of goods
	shipped while fuel consumption over the past three decades remains stable, and creates a fraction
	of the pollution of other transport modes. Rail investment will generate green jobs with a potential
	economic output of \$3.00 for every \$1.00 that is invested.
Recommendations	Tax credits for rail capital investments. A renewal of the expired short line tax credit for short line
	and regional railroads. Development of public-private partnerships between freight
	railroads and passenger rail. Ensure policy promotes quality, and homegrown employment
	opportunities.
