# Demographic Profiles for Local Workforce Investment Areas in California (2021 American Community Survey 5-year estimates)

The U.S. Census Bureau has released a series of **Demographic Profiles** for the 2021 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates. These profiles contain summary data for age, race/ethnicity, sex, household type and relationship, housing occupancy, and the social and economic data, such as income, poverty and labor force.
