
#### California Highlights:

California remains the world's fifth largest supplier of food and agriculture commodities. According to the California Department of Food and Agriculture, "the States agriculture is nearly a \$36.6 billion dollar industry that generates \$100 billion in related economic activity." California's agriculture sector continued to strengthen in the first quarter.

Demand for California wine grapes improved in fourth quarter 2010 and first quarter 2011, and the prices of raisin grapes increased. Agricultural products grown only in the State increased by 15 percent in the first quarter 2011 compared to same time last year. Prices of several products have risen, including dairy, nuts and tree fruits except peaches. Water availability for California farms is better this year after severe shortages last year.

According to the UC Davis Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics, California dominates the nation in organic production of agricultural commodities. The top products include fruits, vegetables, nuts and berries, with lettuce and grapes being the highest value organic crops in California.

### Regional Spotlight: San Joaquin Valley

California has 10 top milk producing counties, with eight of the 10 counties in the San Joaquin Valley Region

This region is the major supplier of the State's number one commodity for first quarter of 2011. The average retail price for a gallon of whole milk in California is \$3.48.


#### San Joaquin Valley



\* For the first six months of 2011, California increased milk production for each month compared to the same time last year. Milk prices increased because the cost of production is at an all time high. The cost for grain, minerals, and supplements were the highest over the last five years.

\* For dairy producers the demand for finished dairy products remains strong. At the beginning of 2011, milk production reflected an positive growth rate of 6 percent compared to the same time last year.

\* The first half of 2011 recorded an increase of 8.9 percent in butter production, a decrease of 10.3 percent in nonfat dry milk production, and increase of 4.6 percent in total cheese production.
