


Industry Employment, which includes self-employment, private household workers, farm, and nonfarm employment in Alpine, Inyo, and Mono Counties, is expected to reach 19,400 by 2024, an increase of 20.9 percent over the 10-year projection period. All nonfarm industry sectors are projected to grow between 2014 and 2024.

Occupational Employment forecasts 3,600 new jobs from industry growth and approximately 4,070 job openings from replacement needs for a combined total of more than 7,670 job openings.


The 50 occupations with the most job openings are forecasted to generate about 5,160 total job openings over the projection period, which is about 67 percent of all job openings. Nearly three quarters of the list is comprised of occupations that require an entry level education of a high school diploma or less, and earn median wages of \$9.47 to \$37.41 per hour. Higher-skilled occupations, requiring a bachelor's degree or higher, earn median annual salaries ranging from \$66,722 to \$98,649.

The 37 fastest growing occupations anticipate a growth rate of 23.7 percent or higher. Nearly a quarter of the occupations are in the food service industry due to the area's large leisure and hospitality sector. These occupations require high school education or less and earn median wages that range from \$9.47 to \$16.99 per hour.



Total nonfarm employment is projected to grow by nearly 3,150 jobs by 2024. Seventy percent of all projected nonfarm job growth is concentrated in three industry sectors.

- Leisure and hospitality is projected to add the most jobs, adding 1,030 jobs. Nearly a third of the nonfarm growth is expected to come from this sector.
- Government is the area's largest industry sector and is expected to add 810 jobs.
- Retail trade is projected to have the third largest growth, adding 360 jobs.
