## LOS ANGELES-LONG BEACH-GLENDALE METROPOLITAN DIVISION (LOS ANGELES COUNTY) Month-over nonfarm employment decreased 70,200

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Los Angeles County increased over the month to 5.4 percent in January 2024, from a revised 5.2 percent in December 2023, and was below the rate of 5.0 percent one year ago. Civilian employment decreased by 5,000 to $4,738,000$ in January 2024, while unemployment increased by 7,000 to 270,000 . The civilian labor force increased by 2,000 over the month to $5,008,000$ in January 2024. (All of the above figures are seasonally adjusted.) The unadjusted unemployment rate for the county was 5.9 percent in January 2024.

The California seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.2 percent in January 2024, 5.1 percent in December 2023, and 4.5 percent a year ago in January 2023. The comparable estimates for the nation were 3.7 percent in January 2024, 3.7 percent in December 2023, and 3.4 percent a year ago.

NOTE: Labor Force and Industry data contained in this release differ from previous information due to the U.S. Department of Labor's annual revision process.

Between December 2023 and January 2024, total nonfarm employment in Los Angeles County decreased by 70,200 to 4,540,000.

- Trade, transportation, and utilities had the greatest job loss over the month, losing 20,500. With the end of the holidays, employment drops off, especially in the retail arena. Retail trade (down 14,800) accounted for 72 percent of the job loss. A decline in transportation, warehousing, and utilities (down 7,600 ) further increased the losses. A gain in wholesale trade (up 1,900) offset the balance of the subsectors.
- Leisure and hospitality (down 16,600) had the largest month-over percentage drop of all nonfarm sectors, shrinking 3.1 percent. Arts, entertainment, and recreation lost 9,500 jobs and accommodation and food services fell by 7,100.
- Professional and business services (down 10,900 ) had job losses in all subsectors. Administrative and support and waste management and remediation services was down 5,300. Professional, scientific, and technical services fell 4,200. Management of companies dropped 1,400.
- Losses in other industries include: Information (down 5,200), construction (down 4,100), other services (down 3,800), government (down 3,400), manufacturing (down 2,400), private education and health services (down 1,800), and financial activities (down 1,500). Mining and logging was unchanged.

Between January 2023 and January 2024, Los Angeles County nonfarm employment increased by 24,100 , or 0.5 percent.

- Private education and health services led all industry sectors adding 52,000 jobs over the year. Gains in health care and social assistance (up 38,600) were mainly driven by added employment in social assistance (up 18,200 ), such as services to individuals, family, and child care. Private educational services contributed an additional 13,400 jobs to the overall increase.
- Leisure and hospitality employment added 11,000 jobs, a 2.1 percent year-over gain. Additions in accommodation and food services (up 13,200) offset a loss of 2,200 jobs in arts, entertainment, and recreation.
- Other industries that added employment were government (up 10,900), other services (up 4,900), trade, transportation, and utilities (up 3,100), and construction (up 2,100).
- Information (down 40,100 ) had the largest year-over contraction. The motion picture and sound recording industries (down 38,000 ) accounted for 95 percent of the information employment decrease. The Writers Guild of America and SAG-AFTRA strikes had a profound effect on employment. These strikes lasted over seven months.
- Professional and business services reported an employment loss of 14,600 jobs, 93 percent was concentrated in administrative and support and waste management and remediation services (down 13,600 ). There were minor losses in management of companies and enterprises (down 600) and professional, scientific, and technical services (down 400).
- Other industry sectors that posted year-over job losses included: manufacturing (down 3,700), financial activities (down 1,400) and mining and logging (down 100).
